The Eiffel Tower is a 324m high structure in the centre of Paris, France. Over the years, it has become a symbol of the city and the country. When they built it, the Eiffel Tower was the tallest building in the world. The tower got its name from its designer, Gustave Eiffel, and it took two years to build, from 1887 to 1889.
